
Upgrading of Ehenye -Oneshila road

The much anticipated road works of the Ehenye - Oneshila road is finally in session, the 500 meter road works is projected to take 4 months commencing on the 18th January – 30th April 2021. The consultant appointed for the road works drawings is Tulipamwe Consulting Engineers while the contractor appointed to carry out the construction work is Sash Trading and Earthworks cc. The overall work is budgeted at 6.2 Million Namibian Dollars. Residents are urged to use alternative routes to avoid damaging of the road.

Onawa residents received their Land Hold Titles

Oshakati Town Council held an official handover of Land Hold Titles to the residents of Onawa during December 2020, this event was officiated by Hon. Calle Schlettwein the Minister of Agriculture, Water and Land Reform. These Land Hold Titles are documents that indicate the ownership of land. Under the Flexible Land Tenure System providing security of tenure to the residents. All residents of Eemwandi location who were relocated to Onawa received their Land Hold Titles.





Relocation of Sky location to Onawa

Part of Council's development plan is to create conducive living environment for the residents of Oshakati. In doing so, Council plans to relocate a total of 482 households from Sky Location to Onawa. These residents will be relocated to a much conducive living area where they will receive surveyed and properly demarcated plots with water, roads and electricity services. The relocation process will be carried out this year 2021. The residents of Sky location have squatted in an area that is overcrowded and have no municipal services hence the living conditions in Sky location have deteriorated.

How to purchase your refuse bin

It is compulsory for every house in all parts of Oshakati to have a refuse bin. Refuse bins can be purchased from Oshakati Town Council at an amount of N\$850.00 which can also be purchased on Installments basis.





New and convenient billing systems

Oshakati Town Council have introduced a new billing system, whereby residents are now able to receive their water bills via SMS and email every month. In the past years, residents have been receiving printed water bills distributed via post mail, however, the old billing system proved to be costly and not efficient. The new billing system have so far received good feedback from the residents however, all residents with un-updated information are urged to contact the Finance department at Oshakati Town Council head office to update their contact details.
